Aims/Objectives/Rationale:			
<p>The module is designed to give learners basic skills for communication in Japanese. It is an integrated module with equal emphasis on the four skills of reading, writing, speaking and listening. The aim is to introduce students to the pronunciation, script, vocabulary and basic structures for simple conversations on predetermined topics. At the end of the module, students should be able to carry out different permutations of simple dialogues and participate in informal conversations.</p>			
Module Content:			
<p>Students are introduced to the pronunciation of Japanese through the use of Romaji (Roman letter) script. Students learn to communicate through scripted dialogues in predetermined contexts and situations. They are then encouraged to use the language more creatively in their interactions. Some of the situational contexts include: descriptions of people and things, introductions and greetings, time, food and drinks, direction and places, and daily routines and leisure. Hiragana script will be gradually introduced throughout the module.</p> <p>Classroom methodology is a combination of paired work, small group interaction and whole class activities. A range of technology including video, audio and ICT is used to support and enhance learning in a nurturing and non-threatening environment.</p>
