Joint Conference by Language Centre, UBD and Academy of Language Studies, UiTM Kedah, Malaysia

In November 2021, the Language Centre, UBD successfully co-hosted an international conference with the Academy of Language Studies (APB) of Universiti Teknologi Mara (UiTM) Kedah titled "International Innovation in Teaching and Learning | Language Education Conference (i-InTeLeC 2021)". The joint conference was held virtually from 9 to 10 November with the central theme "Education 5.0 – Exploring new

frontiers in language and education". The two-day conference included several events: a research workshop, an academic conference, a round table discussion, as well as innovation and video presentation competitions. A research workshop on how to achieve successful "Publications in high--impact journals" was conducted by Associate Professor Dr Nor Fariza Mohd Nor of Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia on the first day.

The official day of the conference was held on the second day which began with the opening ceremony officiated by the guest of honour, Yang Berhormat Dato' Wira Dr Ku Abdul Rahman Ku Ismail, Chairman of the Higher Education Committee, Kedah State Government, followed by welcoming remarks from UiTM Kedah Rector, Professor Dr Haji Mohamad Abdullah bin Haji Hemdi, and Language Centre Director, Dr Yabit Alas. The keynote speech for the conference was delivered by Associate Professor Dr Andrew Littlejohn of SHBIE, UBD, a leading figure in the field of language education who spoke about the direction of language teaching and learning and



the need to experiment with pedagogies that stimulate student abilities such as independence, creativity, critical thinking and problem solving, all of which have been identified as key requisites for the 21st century.

Next was the Round Table Discussion which looked into issues on opportunities and challenges in education brought by advanced technology. The distinguished members of the panel included invited speakers with expertise in language and education from UBD and UiTM (Shah Alam, Selangor). Finally, concluding the conference as the last event was the parallel sessions of the Language Education Conference (LEC). This important collaboration with APB of UiTM Kedah provided an opportunity for LC to further develop and establish academic relations with other language faculties of international institutions.

i-InTeLEC 2021: Round Table Discussion

An engaging forum with the theme "The Future of the Digital Age: Opportunities and Challenges" was held on 10 November 2021 in conjunction with the Language Education Conference (LEC). Among the panelists were academics with expertise in the fields of language and education such as Professor Dr Ahmad Mazli Haji Muhammad of APB, UiTM (Shah Alam), Associate Professor Dr Noor Azam Haji-Othman (Dean of FASS, UBD), Associate Professor Dr Andrew Littlejohn (Deputy Dean of Research at SHBIE, UBD), and Dr Juliana Shak (Lecturer at SHBIE, UBD).

The forum began with an interesting discussion on how far modern technology has sent teaching backwards. Since technology is generally synonymous with 'advancement', the exploration into

issues that show otherwise is significant as these issues tend to be ignored. This is especially relevant to the current switch to online education worldwide as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic. Other important issues that were discussed include the resulting increase in learner autonomy and learner engagement, and the role of remote teaching and learning in creating inequalities of opportunity among students.

Finally, the panelists shared their expert opinions on what opportunities arise from the use of technology to overcome these challenges, along with the skills that educators need to adopt in the changing education landscape and its implications on teaching and learning in the 21st century. The forum ended with questions from members of the audience

who also shared their thoughts about the issues discussed.

i-InTeLEC 2021: International Creative Presentation Award

As part of the i-InTeLEC 2021, an International Creative Presentation Award (ICPA) competition was held with the theme "Enhancing Language Use via Creative Presentation". Students from higher education institutions and schools across Malaysia and Brunei were invited to submit short videos (done in groups) that would showcase not only their proficiency in various languages, but also their creativity in delivering specific messages to society. The winners were announced online on the final day of the conference, with the top prize awarded to students from UBD: Mohd Haziq Fakhry Mohd Bahtiar, Abu Huzaifah Awang Haji Sabli, Ak Ahmad Khairi Pg Haji Anuar, Muhd Zamir Zahran Burhan and Danial Hamizan Reduan, for their Public Service Announcement (PSA) video in Arabic language on handling a pandemic in Brunei Darussalam. Second place went to UiTM Kedah students with their short drama in English, while the 3rd, 4th and 5th places were also bagged by UBD students, with a short drama in Korean, a short drama in Arabic and a PSA in Arabic respectively.

Book translation into Mandarin for the 2021 China Shanghai International Children's Book Fair

A total of 51 book synopses were translated into Mandarin to be showcased at the China Shanghai International Children Book Fair 2021 (CCBF 2021), as part of Brunei's participation in the event.

Japanese Online Interaction Sessions 和歌山大学(日本)バリアブンタウ大学(ベトナム) UBD言語センターの3大学日本語オンライン交流会

Japanese language lecturers from Wakayama University, Japan and the Language Centre, UBD jointly organised an online Japanese language interaction event on 9 September 2021, with 20 students from both universities participating, comprising international students studying Japanese at Wakayama University and UBD students studying Japanese at the Language Centre. With the success of the event, a second session was held on 23 December 2021 with the addition of Vietnamese students studying Japanese language at Ba Ria Vung Tau University, Vietnam, with a total of 50 students from all three universities. The aim of the event was to encourage the use of the Japanese language and to provide a platform for students to communicate in Japanese in a fun and informal environment. During the sessions, the students interacted with each other first by playing bingo games, which was then followed up with presentations about their universities. Finally, unstructured conversation sessions took place in breakout rooms on three topics: self-introduction, learning the Japanese language, and hobbies.

In addition to language accuracy and fluency along with creativity of presentation, each video was assessed based on its positive message, theme execution, originality, as well as students' overall coordination and performance.

Program Komunikasi Profesional Dalam Bahasa Melayu Professional Communication Programme in Malay language

Program Komunikasi Profesional dalam Bahasa Melayu (Professional Communication in Malay Language) telah mula dijalankan pada 17 Januari 2022 sepertimana dijangkakan dalam perancangan tahun lalu. Program yang diatur selama lapan minggu telah berakhir pada 13 Mac 2022. Seramai lapan orang peserta dari Singapura mengikuti program ini. Para peserta adalah terdiri daripada dua orang lelaki dan selebihnya peserta perempuan. Mereka turut menduduki peperiksaan percubaan sebagai langkah persediaan menghadapi peperiksaan sebenar setelah kembali ke Singapura. Sementara itu, tenaga pengajar yang terlibat dalam pelaksanaan program ini seramai dua orang, iaitu Puan Rabi'atul Adawiyyah binti Haji Hassan dan Puan Hajah Zurinah binti Haji Ya'akub dari Pusat Bahasa, UBD.

The Professional Communication Programme in Malay Language commenced on 17 January 2022 as had been scheduled in the previous year. The eight-week long programme had recently ended on 13 March 2022. A total of eight participants from Singapore (two males and six females) took part in the language enrichment programme, after which they sat for a mock examination as part of the preparation for their local examination upon returning to Singapore.
