Aims

- Asking and answering simple questions in areas of immediate need or on very familiar topics.
- Communication through scripted dialogues in predetermined contexts and situations using informal and formal polite forms.
- Use of a range of technology and ICT to support and embrace learning.
- A communicative approach using all four skills with the main emphasis on speaking.

• Vietnamese language, grammatical and lexical items and relevant areas of Vietnamese culture and customs as a bridge to the Brunei culture.

NOTE: Vietnamese will be used increasingly for classroom expressions and basic sentences.
