Aims			
<p>To understand and use familiar everyday expressions and very basic phrases aimed at the satisfaction of needs of a concrete type. Students will also be able to introduce themselves and others and ask and answer questions about personal details. They can interact in a simple way provided the other person talks slowly and clearly and is prepared to help.</p> <p>Students will function at approximately the A1 level of the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR).</p>

Lower Order:	10%	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Develop the pronunciation, script, and basic grammatical structures of Korean. – Develop and use familiar everyday expressions and very basic phrases. 	
Middle Order:	20%	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Apply the language in some situational contexts including introductions and greetings, daily routines and personal information. – Apply information to complete forms with personal details, for example entering name, nationality and address on a registration form. 	
Higher Order:	70%	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Communicate through scripted dialogues in predetermined contexts and situations using informal and formal polite forms. – Engage in interactive language activities, participating in pair work, small group work and whole class work.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – The pronunciation and script of the Korean language and use of basic grammatical structures. – Introduction of self and others, and asking and answering questions about personal details such as where the student lives, people they know and things they have. – Asking and answering simple questions in areas of immediate need or on very familiar topics. – Communication through scripted dialogues in predetermined contexts and situations using informal and formal polite forms. – Use of a range of technology and ICT to support and embrace learning. – A communicative approach using all four skills with the main emphasis on speaking. – Korean language, grammatical and lexical items and relevant areas of Korean culture and customs as a bridge to the Brunei culture. <p>NOTE: Korean will be used increasingly for classroom expressions and basic sentences.</p>
