Aims

To understand the main points of clear, standard input on familiar matters regularly encountered in work, school, leisure, etc. The students can use the language competently and creatively to manage most situations likely to arise while travelling in an area where Vietnamese is spoken. They can describe experiences and events, dreams, hopes and ambitions and give reasons and explanations for opinions and plans in detail.

Students will function at approximately the B1 level of the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR).

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Lower Order: 10%	 Write personal emails describing experiences and impressions. Understand the main points of clear, slowly delivered, standard speech on familiar matters regularly encountered in contexts such as work, school and leisure. Understand and evaluate the main points of current affairs from radio, internet and television on topics of personal or professional interest when the delivery is slow and clear.
Middle Order 20% :	 Apply skills in providing reasons and explanations for opinions and plans. Apply skills in narrating a story or retelling the plot of a book, article or film and in describing reactions and opinions.
Higher Order: 70%	 Communicate more logical, accurate and fluent expression on various topics and in situations such as interviews, problem solving and narration. Produce the language appropriately depending on social contexts and also use written forms and s poken forms more appropriately. Describe emotions and impressions as well as opinions about various issues pertaining to cultural and social subjects.
