## **Aims**

To confidently communicate in everyday social situations and read simple texts from magazines and newspapers on a variety of topics. The students can understand expressions in different registers and understand the social and cultural background. They can write competently in Belait on simple subjects.

Students will function at approximately the A2+ level and may include basic elements of B1 level of the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR).

On successful completion of this module, a student will be expected to be able to:

## **Module Contents**

- Social topics such as campus life, travelling, work, recalling past events, describing people's appearances, looking for ho uses, opening a bank account, weather and activities etc. in informal and formal contexts.
- Initiation, maintenance and management of longer conversations in social contexts.
- Differentiation between and appropriate use of written forms and spoken forms.
- Expression of emotions and impressions as well opinions about various issues pertaining to cultural and social subjects.
- Interactive language activities, participation in pair work, small group work and whole class work.
- Belait language, grammatical and lexical items and relevant areas of Belait culture and customs as a bridge to the Brunei
  culture.

NOTE: Belait will be the primary means of instruction and English explanations will be given for advanced expressions and abstract concepts.
