<p>To understand the structure of various text genres in Belait on matters encountered in life and study and produce various text genres in Belait with a high degree of accuracy. The students can write essays or reports, passing on information or giving reasons in support of or against a particular point of view. They can organize various materials in Belait and deliver them to a target audience effectively on topics of personal interest and experience, and cultural and social subjects, for basic academic purposes.</p> <p>Students will function at approximately the B1+ level and may include basic elements of B2 level of the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR)</p>

<i>On successful completion of this module, a student will be expected to be able to:</i>			
Lower order :	10%	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Grasp and evaluate the main points of short, simple newspaper articles and show a beginning ability to grasp more subtle points. Identify the main points of articles and reports concerned with contemporary problems in which the student can adopt particular attitudes or viewpoints. Identify the main points of moderately-paced speech in a film, documentary, TV/radio programme or podcast. 	
Middle order :	10%	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Search and manage information sources to write essays or reports. Organise information from various sources for an oral presentation. Identify problems and develop ideas for conclusion, counter argument and refutation. 	
Higher order:	80%	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Produce clear, well-structured text, expressing a point of view at some length. Engage critically and logically in question and answer sections of presentations. 	
Module Contents			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Different types and purposes of writing essays in Belait; the essay structure, paragraph structure (topic sentences, introduction and conclusion, coherence and cohesion), development of ideas (main and supporting ideas, counter argument, refutation), and the language of essays in Belait. Skills of organizing and preparing materials for an oral presentation in Belait (including audience awareness and structure of an oral presentation), using visuals and non-linear data, delivery styles and discourse conventions, handling the Q&A session (responding appropriately to questions), and being an engaged audience (appropriate audience protocols). Brainstorming activities in small groups or whole class to develop above-mentioned skills and critical thinking skills. Delivery of oral presentation in Belait. (Student presentations will be recorded for effective feedback which is crucial for progress and self-awareness.) 			
NOTE: Belait will be the primary medium of instruction.
