LC Hosts APCA-ANPOR-UBD Conference

The Language Centre (LC) had the honour of co-organising communication partnerships and networking. the APCA-ANPOR-UBD Conference from 27 to 28 May 2025, involving top-ranked international universities and institutions such as Tsinghua University, Shanghai Jiao Tong University, and Xi'an Jiaotong University, to name a few. This collaboration also marks the first conference where LC served as the primary host, receiving delegates from all over Asia.

The conference was officially launched on 27 May 2025 with an opening ceremony at the Pro-Chancellor Arts Centre, UBD. The event began with a welcoming speech by LC Director, Dr Juliana Shak, followed by welcoming remarks from the chairpersons of each co-organising body: APCA President Mdm Changfeng Chen and ANPOR President Dr Jantima Kheokao. The ceremony culminated with an inspiring opening address by the guest of honour, UBD Vice Chancellor Dr Hazri Kifle.

The ceremony also featured the conference's first keynote address by Professor Jack Qiu from Nanyang Technological University, who opened with 'LLMs and RLWs: A Critical Communication Reflection on Learning in the Age of GenAI', offering timely insights into artificial intelligence and education.

With the theme 'Communication and Languages in Asian-Pacific Regions: Connection, Collaboration and Sustainability', the conference focused on sustainable communication practices; innovations in language education; language, communication and connectivity; linguistic diversity and communication; language policy and sustainability; and education and training in

Aiming to provide a dynamic platform for researchers, practitioners, and policymakers, the conference explored pressing challenges and opportunities within communication and language studies, with a particular focus on integrating sustainable practices into communication and language research as well as education across the Asian-Pacific regions. By emphasising the pivotal role of sustainable communication, the conference underscores its capacity to enhance meaningful collaboration across diverse cultural landscapes and reflects the organisers' commitment to contributing meaningfully to the advancement of communication and language studies.

Keynotes and Parallel Sessions Mark Day 1 of Conference at UBD

After a memorable opening ceremony, the first day of the conference continued with two inspiring keynote addresses and dynamic parallel sessions, beginning with a keynote by Professor Shuhua Zhou from City University of Hong Kong, who spoke on 'Understanding and Curbing Scams: Typology and Appeals'. The session challenged participants to reflect on pressing issues in media, technology, and communication. This was followed by a keynote address by Professor Wei Ran, Chair Professor and Associate Dean of Research and Development at the School of Communication, Hong Kong Baptist University, who spoke on 'Generative AI, Cognitive Strategies and Knowledge Acquisition in the Era of Attention Scarcity', highlighting how emerging technologies are transforming the way people learn, communicate,

and engage with information in a digital-first world.

In the afternoon, participants engaged in parallel sessions at the ILIA Building, where scholars presented their research on themes including language policy, communication connectivity, social media influence, and sustainable practices. Sessions such as Bias Risk in GPT-Driven Data Analysis, Negotiating Language Values in Bilingual Contexts, and Global Dialogues in Communication Studies drew active discussion, while Q&A segments encouraged exchange of ideas between speakers and participants.

The day concluded with a lively mix of academic dialogue and networking opportunities, setting a strong tone for the rest of the conference.


Day 2 of International Conference at UBD Explores AI, Language, and Sustainable Communication

Day 2 of the international conference began with an insightful keynote address delivered by Associate Professor James McLellan, from the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences, UBD. His presentation, 'Sustainable Development Goals and Translanguaging in the Context of Southeast Asia', explored how language practices and inclusive communication can support sustainability and crosscultural understanding across the region.

Following the keynote, participants engaged in parallel sessions that explored language, culture, and technology from multiple perspectives. Topics ranged from multilingual education and gender bias in AI to cultural identity, digital communication, and the preservation of minority languages.

In the afternoon, discussions turned toward education and sustainability in action, featuring research on innovative teaching practices, empathy, and mindfulness in language learning, as well as how technology can enhance classroom experiences. The day concluded with reflections on communication, governance, and how connected communities can drive sustainable progress.

By day's end, the conversations underscored the conference's shared vision: building more connected, sustainable, and culturally inclusive communities through communication and collaboration.

Bridging English Course Resumes

The Bridging English Course (BEC) officially resumed at the Language Centre in March 2025 after a significant hiatus at the university. This English language programme is designed for students who have met university entry requirements but need to further enhance their English proficiency before embarking on their degree studies. Over 14 weeks, students attend four sessions per week and complete regular assessments, concluding with the UBD English Proficiency Test (UBD-EPT) as their final evaluation. Earlier this year, students from the January 2025 intake successfully completed the BEC and subsequently sat for the UBD-EPT in June

2025. Those who achieved a passing score were eligible to use their results to gain admission into UBD's undergraduate programmes.

The BEC will continue to serve as a pathway for students aspiring to strengthen their English skills and pursue higher education at UBD. The next session will be open for application from January 2026 and interested applicants can find more information via the UBD Online Admissions Application System (OASys) or contact the Language Centre at office.lc@ubd.edu. bn.

Osaka-Shizuoka Students Take on Oral Presentation Skills

Students from Osaka University and Shizuoka University recently took part in a special programme aimed at enhancing their oral presentation skills through the UBD Global Discovery Programme – English Communication for Career Advancement, facilitated by English Communication Skills lecturers from the Language Centre. Originally launched for Osaka University students, the programme has since expanded to include participants from other universities, this time from Shizuoka University, reflecting the growing collaboration and academic ties between UBD and these institutions.

Throughout the programme, students developed essential communication skills, focusing on public speaking, confidence-building, and the fundamentals of formal presentations. The

classes combined theory-based sessions with interactive practical activities, giving participants ample opportunity to apply techniques in real-time. The programme concluded with individual student presentations on topics linked either to their own research or issues relevant to Brunei, showcasing their growth in both confidence and delivery.

This collaborative programme not only strengthened students' presentation abilities but also reinforced the partnership between UBD, Osaka University, and Shizuoka University, promoting mutual understanding and intercultural exchange. The experience highlighted the enduring importance of strong communication skills as a foundation for students' future academic and professional success.
